

Welcome to Papuan Voices,

We invite you to screen the Papuan Voices videos with your family, your friends, your community, organisations, nonprofits, faith-based organizations, and youth groups to educate and help raise awareness about the situation in West Papua.

In return for providing the videos and resource materials, we ask that you please let us know the details of your screening, linking to any blog posts and showing us pictures, and then follow up with comments on how it went and what was useful. We would love you to place our link, papuanvoices.net, on your website (we will do the same).

The easiest way to host a screening is to order the Papuan Voices DVD, which includes all nine videos ready to be played on your DVD player. The videos are also available at papuanvoices.net. Make sure you download high quality versions of the files, with subtitles. There is also a torrent available with all the videos and resources packaged as one download. If the videos do not yet include subtitle in your language, please contact us about how to add them. We have provided a sample program here to help you plan your screening.

If you are not planning on screening all nine videos, for example, if you are including one as part of an environment-focused screening, or a screening on Indonesia, download the single videos at papuanvoices.net.

We also have a study guide that contains background to the issues in West Papua as well as a detailed analysis of each video in the series. As part of the study guide we have provided a number of 'Talking Points', in the forms of questions, that we hope will help you begin discussions around each video.
